Home décor for a Holi-day!

Synthetic colours generally leave tough stains on the walls, however one should avoid rubbing the walls too hard. Instead resort to light dabbing with soft cotton muslin in order to avoid damage to wall colour.

With kids running amuck in and out of home after playing Holi, special attention needs to be given to protect the sheer of wooden frames and doors. An application of water-based enamel for frames is perfect for windows and doors.

It is strongly advised to use non-toxic colours for Holi time just to protect the walls of one's house but even otherwise it is recommended to go for organic colours and stay away from the harmful effects of the synthetic ones.

This year, as you prepare your skin before you dash yourself into this bonanza, invest sometime to prepare your walls. Then don't forget, because your wall colours are safe this Holi.
